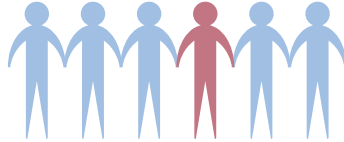

In our June Church Conference our Trustees made the following recommendation in regards to the continued work of our Sanctuary/Narthex Expansion Committee. The motion was approved unanimously and the next steps will be to recommend to the church those who will be new members to the committee's work. The process of planning for our future in ministry is an important and enormous task. This committee will continue to explore what possibilities are available to us in regards to our facilities and campus and report their findings and recommendations to the church during the process. For those who were not able to be in our June Church Conference, please read the Trustees statement and recommendation.

Sanctuary/Narthex Expansion Committee Proposal

On December 18, 2007 the trustees discussed crowding in the narthex and sanctuary area and decided to recommend to the church that a feasibility study be done to determine the possibility of expanding the narthex and sanctuary. On January 20, 2008 at the church conference, the trustees asked for the church's blessing on doing the feasibility study and the church approved. After research and consultations, the trustees determined it was feasible and returned to the church on September 21, 2008 to recommend the formation of an Ad Hoc committee to further investigate the potential of a sanctuary/narthex expansion and to bring reports and recommendations back to the church. After a search for committee members, the church voted to form the Sanctuary/Narthex committee on October 19, 2008 and 12 members were approved along with 6 board and committee chairs. In January of 2009, a 13th member was added to the committee and approved by the church in conference. The committee met throughout the year and returned to church conference on November 15, 2009 recommending the church approve up to \$60,000 to be used to employ WKWW Architects for planning and recommendations.

After the architects were engaged, the committee met with them and held focus group meetings with various church members and leaders. From the focus groups it was discovered there was an interest in developing a master plan that would consider potential use, improvements and expansion of whole church facility. This led the committee to realize that this could potentially be bigger in scope than what the church had initially approved. On May 13, 2010, Shannon Rouse, the chair of the sanctuary/narthex committee, met with the Trustees and reported the findings and the committee's concerns that the scope could potentially be bigger. After discussion by the Trustees, we would like to make the following recommendation:

- Rename the Sanctuary/Narthex Committee to Facility Master Planning Committee.
- Expand the scope of the committee by directing them to develop a plan for the potential expansion and use of the church's facilities and campus.
- Ask them to report back to the Trustees and the church, the committee's findings, progress and any recommendations for church approval.
- Increase the size of the committee by 6 members for a total of 19 members due to the expansion of the scope and to insure that all ages and ministries are represented.

As we continue through the Summer I hope that you are finding some time for rest and family. Don't forget to stay connected to your church family as well. Make church a priority when you are in town and take the time to tell others that you miss them when they are absent this Summer.

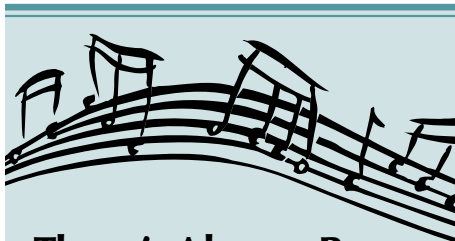

Words from Lydia Tatum...

I want to begin by saying that I am beyond thrilled to begin my time ministering here at TBC. For a couple months now, my soul has longed to be here with you, and now that I am here it can commence with rejoicing!

Calling is a funny thing. It is not always an easy thing to discern, but my calling here was loud and clear. 1 Samuel 3 has long been a favorite passage of mine, and I find it particularly relevant in this moment.

Samuel was a miracle child given to Hannah after her struggle with barrenness and countless prayers to God. Hannah promised that if she were to conceive a son that she would then give him back to God, and that she did. Samuel was raised knowing about God, but as it is clear in the third chapter, he did not yet know God - much like many who are raised in the church feel before they finally meet God and are officially "Saved."

The scene is set late one night while Samuel is sleeping but is then awakened by an audible voice calling his name, "Samuel, Samuel!"

Three times, Samuel rises from his bed and runs to Eli, ready to do whatever is asked, and each time Eli denies that it was he who called. But, on the third try, realizes that Samuel is hearing the voice of God and instructs him to respond, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening!" Samuel does just that, and thus begins his walk with God.

My calling to be with you was not quite audible, but it was close! I am thankful for the calling I have heard, and for the willingness to follow what God has placed in my heart. As we prepare for our journey of faith together, I pray that each of us may have the spirit of Samuel, and that we may each eagerly respond to God's call with an emphatic, **"Speak, Lord For Your Servant Is Listening!"**

Thoughts for Parents...

Where are all the Toys?

Many parents wonder what kind of toys is selected for use in your child's rooms. Bible teaching is our primary goal; therefore we use toys that are free of cartoon or fantasy characters. Toys with cartoon or fantasy characters direct a child's attention toward the character and prevent the teaching of Bible truths.

Most of the toys in a preschool room are stored out of sight of preschoolers. A few toys are selected to heighten each session emphasis. Fewer toys give your child a better setting for making choices. Too many toys frustrate a child and lead to dumping or scattering them about the room. If a child is given a choice of what toy to play with, his desire to explore the toy in a variety of ways is increased.

The Bible thoughts and Bible story conversation can be used while a child is at play. Toys that are selected for use with babies or ones stimulate them to explore, discover, create, exercise and refine their skills. Bright, contrasting, colorful toys keep a child's interest and do not merely attract his attention for a brief period of time. These toys are designed to be washed and disinfected in a bleach solution, and then left to air dry.

The toys that are selected for each session are safe, clean, and age appropriate; promote learning and skill development; and enhance your child's spiritual development. We take seriously our responsibility of teaching your child. Every child is important to us.

Reminders for Parents of Babies

- Please label all items belonging to your child. (diaper bags, bottles, extra clothing).
- Formula, mother's milk, or other bottles sent from home should be fully prepared, dated and labeled for your child.
- Please stock the diaper bag with an ample supply of diapers for your child.
- Please have adequate changes of clothing for your child.
- Please remember that your child should only be released to his/her significant adult who has the appropriate security tag or pager.
