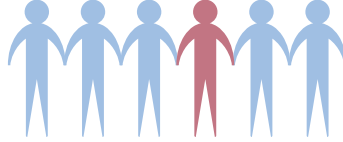

# By-Laws Change

Section 35. Bereavement Ministry. The Bereavement Ministry Committee shall minister immediately and specifically to families of deceased Trinity Baptist Church resident church members who are not Sunday School members. upon the death of such members. In the event the funeral of a non-resident Trinity member is held in Raleigh, North Carolina, the Committee will minister to this family also. The Committee shall provide follow-up support for a reasonable time to this family in the form of visits, telephone calls, and a gift of relevant reading material as deemed appropriate and welcomed. The Committee shall also support and assist Sunday School classes that minister to families of one of its deceased class members, but the Committee does not replace any ministry the Sunday School class provides. In these cases the deceased may, or may not, be a church member. The Committee shall seek support from other church members in fulfilling the functions of this ministry, especially from members of the Sunday School class to which the deceased member belonged.

Details for this ministry are provided in Trinity's Guidelines and Procedures manual under "Bereavement Ministry Committee."

The Committee shall be composed of 12 church members representing Departments

1 through 5. Department representatives on the Committee shall be: one from Department 5 ~~4~~, one from Department ~~4~~ 2, two from Department 3, three from Department ~~2~~ 4, three from Department 1 5, plus two at-large members. The at-large members will be selected ~~by the Committee~~ on Committees from any department.

## Year-End Contribution Reminder

Any contributions that you want to be on your 2010 tax statement, must be turned into the Financial Secretary by December 31st.

The ONLY exception to this rule is an envelope postmarked by December 31st. Please remember that the church office will be closed: Thursday, December 23rd, Friday, December 24th and Monday, December 27th.

It's drawing near. Christmas is upon us. Does that realization strike fear in your heart? So often we buy into this idea of Christmas madness. We are encouraged to be frantic by Christmas commercials, Christmas sit-com episodes, and even our beloved Christmas movies. Everywhere we turn the message is that these four weeks before Christmas are supposed to be the most stressful and action-packed weeks of the year. American Christmas consumerism delights at our sense of urgency that begins on Black Friday; and no matter how many "Jesus is the reason for the season" Christmas tchotchkes they sell us, we still buy into the rush and consumerism.

## Your Child is Learning

Do you realize how intensely your young child hungers to learn? Watch as he or she explores the house from corner to corner. Your child probably delights in unwinding the toilet paper, pulling out the pots and pans, and sometimes eating the pet food!

Children learn the way God designed them to learn—from their everyday experiences. It's important for parents to know how to participate in the process.



Children learn a significant part of their fundamental life skills through play activities. Their physical development is strengthened, refined, and improved through climbing, crawling, running, and throwing. Their mental development progresses through stacking, manipulating and experimenting with the everyday objects around them. Their social development is enhanced as they learn to play near others.

Recognize that each child is unique in the way he or she develops and learns. Don't fall into the worrisome trap of comparing one child's development with another's for every one of them will develop differently! Relax and enjoy your child's individual pace.
