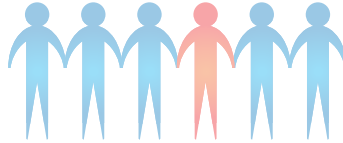

Before the early church was known as Christians, they were people who were known as People of the Way. They were simply people who followed Jesus. In the past several months I have become convinced as your pastor that we need to spend more time learning about the words and actions of Jesus. The words of Jesus are words that challenge us and many times cause us to question whether Jesus really meant what he said. We sometimes wonder how we can possibly keep Jesus' instructions or follow Jesus' example. It is true that we will fail in our attempts to follow Jesus, but that must not keep us from trying and learning from the times we fail. Following Jesus is not like taking a test; instead, it is like learning about someone in a relationship and discovering along the way the things that bring joy to the other in the relationship. In 2010, we need to get to know Jesus more. This is why in our first semester of CLUE, I will be teaching from the gospel of Luke. During our men's TNT study on Tuesday nights I will be teaching a course entitled "Journey to the Cross." I will cover the same material in a different format during our Wednesday night study in the Chapel. I want to encourage our men to be a part of TNT. To sign up for TNT just call the church office or e-mail my assistant, Reenie Shore, at rshore@tbcraleigh.com. Our first night is January 19th and we will begin with a Chili Supper and orientation. Our Wednesday night schedule begins on January 13th and there is no sign up needed to attend our Wednesday night study in the Chapel.

This coming Sunday I will be preaching my annual "state of the church" sermon. As I am finishing my 10th year as your pastor, I think it will be a good time for us to look back and celebrate all that God has done at Trinity in the past decade; also, let us begin the process of discovering God's future for us. I am looking forward to spending some time with you celebrating and dreaming.

I recently had an opportunity to stop for a few minutes and read parts of *Youthworker Journal*, a professional journal for youth ministers. An article by Evan Hunter caught my attention entitled *Moving Students Toward Maturity*. The article began with this paragraph:

“A recent Barna study reveals the disturbing fact that most Christians remain quite unsure of the goal and process of growing in Christ. When asked to articulate their idea of spiritual maturity, 80 percent said they believe it mostly entails “keeping the rules.” Although most want to move forward in their journey with Christ, the majority do not know what their church or pastor expect from them or how to go about that growth.”

These are not encouraging words to say the least. The Church is not doing a good job of articulating and modeling spiritual growth. If our students are leaving our youth ministry and going off to college believing that spiritual maturity boils down

to “keeping the rules,” there is an obvious communication break down.

What I pray our students understand before he or she graduates high school is that his or her faith is exactly that, HIS or HER'S. A student has to own his or her own faith before he or she can really begin to grow in the faith journey. Once a student owns his or her own faith, maturity occurs as he or she develops a Christian worldview reflecting his or her faith in Christ. Furthermore, his or her faith is applied to real life situations as he or she makes decisions. Loving God and loving others in the same way shape the way a spiritually mature person decides on his or her choice of career, dating relationships and life with others.

The faith journey of middle school, high school and college students are fragile. Many things of the world lead them astray. Commit to putting our students at TBC on your prayer list for the year. Help them to know Trinity cares about their faith maturity!

Thoughts for Parents

Keeping Preschoolers Healthy



Preschoolers and children showing signs of communicable illness should not be brought to church. If preschoolers develop symptoms during care, a parent or guardian should be contacted to pick up the child as soon as possible.

Signs of communicable illness that would be reason to exclude the child from participation include:

- A fever (100 degrees or more in the armpit, 101 degrees orally, or 102 degrees rectally). Child should be fever free for 24 hours
- Diarrhea
- Severe coughing
- Two or more episodes of vomiting within the past 12 hours
- Red eye with white or yellow eye discharge, until 24 hours after treatment
- Yellow or green nasal discharge
- Chicken pox or a rash suggestive of chicken pox
- Strep Throat, until 24 hours after treatment begins

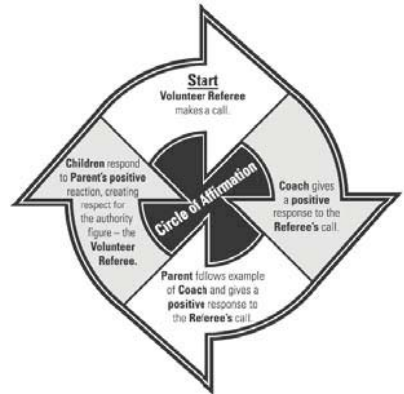
