

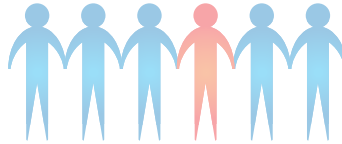

In our February Church Conference the Personnel Committee informed the church of their work in regards to establishing a Student Ministry Associate position at Trinity Baptist Church. This past year the Personnel Committee and the Student Ministry Advisory Committee have been in discussion to determine the needs of the Student Ministry. Under the leadership of Rev. Jung our student ministry has grown to over 200 active students and the need for more leadership is evident to both committees and our deacons who voted to support this new position. During the past three years, our Student Internship has grown in scope and purpose and has helped address the need in the student ministry. However, the Personnel Committee and SMAC now believe it is time to establish a permanent position which would give the ministry stability for the future. This new position will focus mainly on Middle School Students and also assist Rev. Jung with the overall ministry to students. The position will at this time replace our current internship program. Our current student intern, Jenny Lee, will be finishing her contract in August of 2010. The position will also not require a budget change due to the funds available through both the Personnel Budget and the Student Ministry Budget for 2010.

In our March 21st Church Conference, the Personnel Committee will recommend this permanent position and also present a job description to be approved. If approved, a search team of Personnel Committee members and SMAC members will be established to seek a candidate for recommendation to the church. The process will follow the procedure to call a minister as stated in the Church Constitution and By-Laws. If you would like to view the job description for the Associate position, it can be accessed on Trinity's website.

We have truly been blessed with Rev. Jung's leadership in our Student Ministry and now we have the opportunity to discern God's direction in this growing ministry. You are encouraged to be a part of this time of discussion and decision during Church Conference on March 21st at 7:00 p.m. in the Chapel.

## NC Baptist Disaster Relief Training

NCBM Disaster Relief Training is available to all believers who have a passion to serve others. Disaster response is a unique mission experience because of the sudden nature of the event, difficult conditions, and high expectations from non faith-based groups and survivors.

There are 24 different classes being offered this year in four (4) training categories:

**Basic** (beginning) Choices include: Disaster Relief Chaplaincy, Communications, International Search and Rescue, Medical Reserve Corps, Temporary Childcare, Mass Feeding, Recovery, Shower/Laundry, and Water Purification.

**Crosstrainer** (already trained in one area but want training in another)

**Recertification** (have been trained before, but need recertification) It is a 1/2 day course. We are offering recertification training on Friday night so that you can cover the class and pick-up an Advanced course on Saturday if you like.

**Advanced** (leadership) - for those with a CURRENT NCBM Disaster Relief training photo id. This category includes: Administration, Assessment, Advance Chaplaincy, Evangelism, and Points of Distribution.

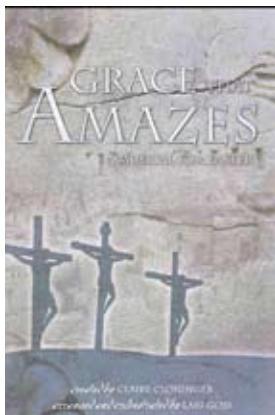

Four years ago, The Student Ministry Advisory Committee, along with the support of the Missions Committee, decided that the high school students would take a foreign mission trip every four years in order for a student to have an opportunity to go outside of our borders. In the summer of 2007, 75 students and adults made an impact through World Changers in Puerto Rico. Through that experience, I learned a couple of things... first, a foreign experience makes a huge impact on the lives of our students. Second, I don't ever want to travel that far with that many people again!

Summer of 2011 will be the next opportunity for our high school students to travel overseas. After much research and prayer, I have been led to choose Cuzco, Peru as our destination through a mission organization called Frontline Peru. The mission groups will build homes, work with the children in orphanages and support the local churches in sharing God's love with the people of Cuzco. Our students will experience the culture of Peru, learn more about meeting needs in a foreign country and ultimately grow in their spiritual journey through the experience. In addition, while in Peru, the students will have an opportunity to visit Lima, Cuzco and Machu Picchu.

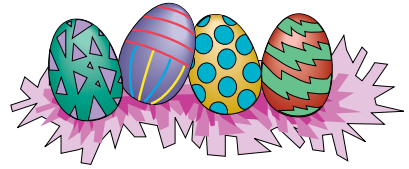
