

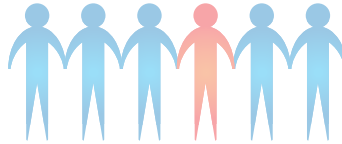

I have been enjoying the book *Praying: Finding our Way through Duty to Delight* by J.I. Packer and Carolyn Nystrom. One of my favorite chapters is entitled “Brooding.” The illustration is given of a hen that is incubating her eggs. This process is called brooding. The description of the hen is to just sit there and not move. The hen is inactive and can appear lazy during this time but that is not the case. In fact her brooding is leading to breeding that is creating new life. In describing the process of spiritual brooding, Packer describes a process of setting our minds on Christ and purposely reflecting, thinking and considering the very nature of God with the hope that this time will also create new life in us. Most of our brooding is something we do from time to time over problems. This self indulgent brooding occurs when anxious thoughts fill our minds. Sometimes these moments are the result of real problems and other time these moments are due to worry about what might occur. Either way this type of brooding does not add to life but instead steals our joy. However, brooding, that is thinking, about God can lead us to new life. There are three helpful considerations in our spiritual brooding. First, we must brood with God on God. In our time of prayer spend time just thinking about the nature of God and the moments that God has acted in your life. Second, we should brood on the word of God. Spend time not only reading the Bible but meditating on it. Think about what you read. Sometimes that means only one verse today is enough if it causes you to have a moment to reflect and think. Last, whenever our thought processes fail us and we find ourselves unable to concentrate in the moment of prayerful brooding (and they will), return to the subject or the passage you are using and try again.

Lent seems like a good time to do some brooding. It is a great season to substitute for some activity some moments of thinking and meditating on God and God’s word. This we know: just as Lent leads to Easter, meditating on God will lead to new spiritual understanding and godly lives.

NC Baptist Disaster Relief Training

Friday/Saturday, March 19-20
Harnett County

NCBM Disaster Relief Training is available to all believers who have a passion to serve others. Disaster response is a unique mission experience because of the sudden nature of the event, difficult conditions, and high expectations from non faith-based groups and survivors. We often say that after your first response you will either love the relief ministry or hate it. We hope God calls you to this type of ministry and that you exercise that calling through NCBM Disaster Relief.

There are 24 different classes being offered this year in four (4) training categories:

Basic (beginning) - If you've never trained with us before, you're in the right place. It is a 2-day orientation to the Disaster Relief ministry which includes history, policies, procedures, and technical training in the field you choose. Choices include: Disaster Relief Chaplaincy, Communications, International Search and Rescue, Medical Reserve Corps, Temporary Childcare, Mass Feeding, Recovery, Shower/Laundry, and Water Purification.

Crosstrainer (already trained in one area but want training in another) - If you have trained with us before (hold a current (non-expired) NCBM DR photo id badge), then you can cross train in another Basic class without going through the introductory material. This will save you

some time and money. The same choices of training areas are available as in "Basic" above.

Recertification (have been trained before, but need recertification) - for those who have an expired NCBM Disaster Relief photo id. You must recertify in Basic training course listed on your badge before you can move on to Advanced Training. It is a 1/2 day course. We are offering Recert. training on Friday night so that you can cover the class and pick-up an Advanced course on Saturday if you like. This category includes: Disaster Relief Chaplaincy, Communications, Temporary Childcare, Mass Feeding, Recovery, Shower/Laundry, and Water Purification.

Advanced (leadership) - for those with a CURRENT NCBM Disaster Relief training photo id. If your badge is not current, please Recertify on Friday night, then take Advance course on Saturday. You will find Recertification information above. Some of the classes are Friday night, some Saturday, some are both. Some require pre-requisites. Please read registration information carefully. This category includes: Administration, Assessment, Advance Chaplaincy, Evangelism, and Points of Distribution.

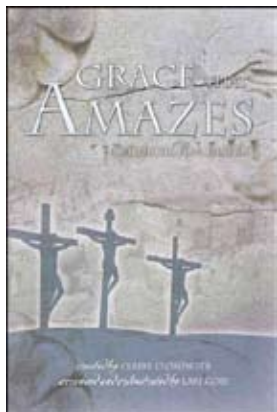

In a recent survey by George Barna, a research specialist, more than 8 in 10 adults in the U.S. claim they had weekly religious education before age 12. Of those, 69 percent now attend religious programs weekly. Fewer adults recall regular participation as teens, with 50 percent of current attenders recalling at least monthly involvement in some kind of youth program.

This is not a groundbreaking piece of information by any means. For years, we have known that the foundation parents help to lay in church attendance makes a difference in the spiritual growth of children and youth's future. However, this is a good

reminder to all adults that what we do on a weekly basis matters to the future spiritual maturity of our students.

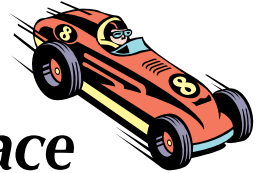
Thank you for being the kind of church that respects all ages and welcomes them into the worshipping space. Lent may hold more meaning to you if you share in it with a child.

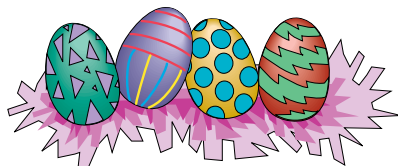
