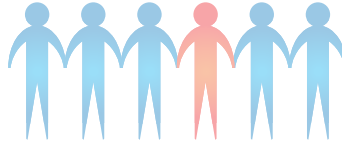

## Belize Summer Mission

July 17-24 • VBS, Dental Clinic, Revival

This will be our third trip to the village of St. Margaret, partnering with Lagoon Road Baptist Church. They are a new church start, only 4 years old, and the only English-speaking church in the village. Co-bi-vocational pastors Ed and Modesto have done a wonderful job in growing this congregation to around 90 in attendance on Sunday mornings. But there are many more people in St. Margaret, as well as two more nearby villages.

When we met them in early 2009, they were meeting in one large room – their sanctuary, and a temporary room made by building a wall behind the pulpit for the children. Trinity has now assisted them financially and physically to build four large Sunday School classrooms for children and youth as well as two restrooms (they were using an outhouse).

Continuing to follow God's lead, it is now time to involve a different kind of team in this partnership... one that will reach out to the community to share the Gospel through a four-day Vacation Bible School with 150 children, and through a five-evening revival with Dr. Roberts as the preacher. Obviously this must be a large mission team of at least 30 adults age 18 and above.

Rhonda Gubbins will be our mission VBS director, and has already gotten the curriculum materials that we need. We would also love to be able to create a worship choir out of the folks doing the VBS for the evening revival services. In addition, we are attempting to recruit at least one dentist and several assistants/hygienists to do a dental clinic for the village. We actually have use of a fully equipped dental trailer for this purpose – all we need are volunteers.

Cost for this trip (assuming air fares do not increase dramatically) will be around \$1,200 per person including air and ground transportation, lodging, food, and insurance. You will need a passport, but no visa is required. Several vaccinations are also an expense that is additional.

I would like to express my appreciation to all of you who helped to make my visiting family members feel so welcome a couple of Sundays ago. My birth mother, my brother and his family enjoyed their short visit to Raleigh and to Trinity Baptist. It was a special opportunity for my mother to see where I live and where I serve in my ministry.

Many of you have asked about my family in the past few weeks so I thought I would take a moment to help connect some dots. Shortly after my birth in Seoul, Korea, my father took a giant leap of faith to come to America to establish himself in order to bring the rest of the family over. What was to be a six-month process turned into a six year journey. During those six years, I lived with my paternal grandparents but saw my mother on occasion. My parent's marriage did not survive the six-year separation when my father was able to make it back to Korea.

Upon returning back to Korea to bring my brother and I to the United States, my father remarried and brought the entire family to North Carolina at once. I started a new life in Sanford, NC with my father, step-mother,

biological brother and step-brother. During this time, I lost all contact with my birth mother who remained in Korea.

About 10 years ago, my brother sought to find our birth mother in order to reunite with her. After some searching, he was able to find her still living in Korea. Shortly thereafter, my birth mother visited my brother at his home in Hackensack, NJ. Amy and I traveled to NJ to meet my birth mother, whom I had very little recollection of. It was a special moment in my life.

Since then, she has made several trips back to the United States and I have even made a trip to Korea to spend some time with her. Unfortunately, our connection has been limited due to the language barrier...I have forgotten most of my Korean and she has limited knowledge of English. This last visit was my mother's first trip to Raleigh. Though it was short (24 hours), it was nonetheless a special time for her and for me. Thank you again for helping my family to feel so welcome and for the way you always love me.
