

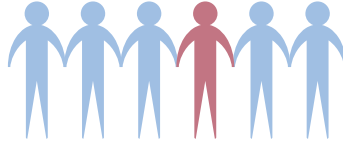

When I was in seminary I remember being taught that there were two ways churches communicated. Some churches we were told were verbal churches. This meant that nothing was ever really announced until someone, usually the pastor, made the announcement from the pulpit. In these churches you could put announcements in the bulletin or the newsletter but it was not until it was announced that it really was communicated. In contrast, there were churches that valued written communication. You could announce meetings and events throughout the service, but until it was written down in the bulletin or placed on a calendar it did not exist. I learned it was important to discover what type of church you were serving and then adjust your communication. Although we still communicate by both of these methods there is now another way we communicate and that is electronically. Many of us not only get our information from our newsletter or bulletin but also from our website. We not only listen for announcements from the pulpit, but also look for e-mails about ministry ideas and opportunities.

I have recently returned from my annual spring retreat with pastors and have become convinced that we also need to take another step in our communication. As we will continue to communicate through these traditional ways, we are also seeking ways to communicate with a new generation. We have created a Facebook Group which will allow our church members to join and receive updated announcements about the church as well as post comments about their church experiences. This Facebook Group page will allow us not only to communicate in another way, but also is a great outreach tool as we can share what is happening at Trinity with others on Facebook. In addition to Facebook, I will begin using Twitter to do a daily thought for reflection. This reflection will be entitled "Words From Jesus." The concept is to share a saying of Jesus and then one or two comments on that saying. This short devotional thought will appear on Twitter as well as our Facebook group page. I would love for you to utilize this devotion everyday if you choose.

If you are new to Facebook or Twitter, you can reach our pages from the links that you will find at the bottom of the home page of our church website. I know that for many this way of communication is new and will not be useful, yet we must realize as a multi-generational church that this method of communication and outreach is very useful to our younger generations. I hope that whether you participate in these methods or not,

It has been an amazing journey already! I can't believe how quickly the process has moved but I am thrilled! Never in my wildest dreams did I think our search for the new Student Ministry Associate would have progressed this far, this quickly.

This past Sunday night at Church Conference, David York (chair of the Student Ministry Associate Search Team) presented to those in attendance that the search team has selected a candidate to present to the church family in the near future. Out of more than 40 resumes we had received, this candidate rose to the top. The search team interviewed five well qualified candidates during the initial round of interviews. The team was able to narrow down the list to two possible candidates and more extensive interviews were held. After the second round of interviews, the search team unanimously voted to pursue the call with the candidate.

There will be few more steps to take before this candidate is officially called

to our church to be Trinity's first Student Ministry Associate. The entire Personnel Committee and the Student Ministry Advisory Committees will need to meet and agree on the candidate the search team has selected. Afterward, the candidate's bio will be shared through Trinity Times and an In-View-Of-Call weekend will be scheduled for June 5-6. The church family will have an opportunity to meet the candidate over the weekend. The candidate will share briefly during both morning services followed by a special called business meeting to vote on the candidate by secret ballot.

Throughout this process, I have been amazed at how God has been at work. I have recognized how God has been preparing this candidate and our student ministry even before we knew to create this position. Please continue to pray for the process and the beginning of a new minister on our church staff. I can't wait till you have a chance to meet the candidate!

Helping Out and First Chores



Everyday routines provide invaluable opportunities for your preschooler to learn about things, practice using skills, and become a contributing member of the family. Being able to pitch in with household work makes him feel competent, helping to build his sense of pride and responsibility. Doing too much for your child can slow down his development, so you shouldn't think that you're depriving or harming him by having him help out around the house and giving him chores to do.
