

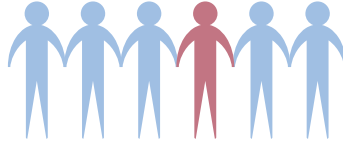

Our Trustees gave the following report as part of our May Church Conference. I am very grateful for the work they are doing and coordinating. I hope their report will help you stay informed concerning our challenges and opportunities at Trinity.

Trustee Report:

Sunday night, May 16 the Trustees gave an update on projects and other work the board has addressed in 2010 to the church in business conference. The following is a summary of the report:

First, we have taken a look at the overall financial status of our church with particular attention to our debt. The church has a strong balance sheet. As of 12/2009 the church has \$15,837,199 in assets and \$1,370,184 in debt. This comes to a net worth of \$14,467,015. The only current debt we have is the mortgage on the ROC and Children's Building. At our current pace, we will be debt free in 6.5 years or sooner. Trinity Baptist remains on solid financial footing thanks to the blessings of God, the faithful giving of our members, and the stewardship of our ministers and staff.

Second, we have been in contact with our Buildings and Grounds Committee about some maintenance concerns and the plans they are making to address them. A number of items have already been addressed and others are being evaluated. The HVAC units in Buildings B and D are currently being updated. Building B is complete and Building D is currently in process. These two buildings have had cooling and heating issues for a number of years and this make them more efficient and much less likely to have problems. The movable partitions in the Fellowship have been repaired and are now in working order. Finally, Building and Grounds have evaluated the dated bathrooms in Building B and D and are working on a proposal for updating them. When they have completed the proposal, they will bring it before the church to discuss and decide if the expense is something we want to move forward with.

Third, we have been discussing our parking situation on Sunday mornings. Miller Warren has headed up this project for the Trustees and has done extensive research on our parking, the cross walk and possible solutions to this inconvenience. He will be meeting with Dr. Roberts to start implementing some of the recommendations we have come up with. We are working very hard to come up with practical solutions and ways to educate the church in adapting to the changes that may need to occur.

Finally, we have met with the Narthex/Sanctuary Expansion Chair and have discussed some of the information that came out of the focus groups this committee conducted. Again, we are excited about what we are hearing from this committee and from the focus groups. The Trustees will make a motion at the business meeting in June regarding the Narthex/Sanctuary Expansion Committee as we continue to look forward to what God is planning for Trinity Baptist Church.

We thank you for trusting us with so many important decisions as we strive to be proactive in facing the issues of the church, and we will continue to seek God's guidance as we look to the future.
