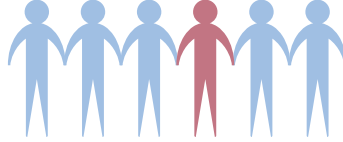

## Why Does My Child Cry When I Leave?

There are several reasons why a young child may cry when their parents leave.

- The child may cry because he/she now realizes you still exist although you are out of sight.
- As babies and ones develop, they may experience stranger and separation anxieties. During this time, a child's emotions are intense but short lived.

Both of these are a healthy part of emotional development.

### Tips for Keeping the departure less stressful

- Talk positively about your child's teachers, activities, and friends.



- Keep the morning calm and unrushed.
- Develop a goodbye routine (even with newborns). Try a gentle hug and a simple "Mommy will come back"
- Excitedly encourage your toddler to walk to his room, carry his bag and knock on the door.
- Never sneak away. Be calm and leave promptly. If your child clings, calmly remove him. Kindly say "Daddy will come back." Leave in a confident manner.

## *Be a part of* Extended Teaching Care

Extended Teaching Care (ETC) is a ministry that enables parents to place their babies and preschoolers in a secure learning environment during our worship services. ETC can only be provided with the use of volunteers. We are constantly seeking adults who love children and are willing to work and care for them in a nurturing way. Remember, you only need to serve 4 times a year and this small amount of time could make a BIG difference in the life of a child... and their parents!
