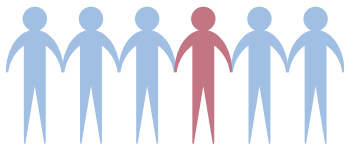

I am looking forward to seeing you this Sunday as we celebrate our nation's freedom and the gift of freedom that God gives to all. Remember with it being July 4th we will have only one worship service at 10:00 a.m. There will be a Continental Breakfast at 9:00 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Come and enjoy the fellowship and worship as a part of your July 4th celebration.

This time of year I am reminded of Trinity's commitment to missions. Our High School students are returning from Alabama where they participated in CBF's Rural Poverty Initiative. This initiative is a 20 year commitment by CBF to our nation's 20 poorest counties. As part of this same initiative one of our mission teams have gone back to McCreary County Kentucky to serve in ministry this week. In just a few weeks our Belize Team will travel back to Belize where our partnership continues with the Lagoon Baptist Church. They will be leading VBS with children, conducting a dental clinic and leading a revival at night. In August our College Students will travel to the Seattle area to work with Native Indians. In addition to all of our teams that are going and ministering the summer, we have several individuals who are spending the summer in Africa and other places in ministry. Trinity is definitely a church that is "going" in the name of Christ. Remember that even if you do not go out of state or out of the country, you are an "ambassador for Christ" everyday. God bless you as you go in the name of the Lord.

In July our Minister for Childhood Education, Rev. Karen Metcalf, will be taking her sabbatical. Karen has faithfully served our congregation for 16 years and is definitely due a sabbatical. Her itinerary includes opportunities for her to not only lead conferences, but continue her education and development in Switzerland and at our seminary in Prague. Karen will have the opportunity to spend time with Baptists from across Europe and she will be sharing her knowledge and learning from them. She also will have some time of rest as part of her time away. Please pray for Karen as she travels and pray that God will use this time for her to grow and rest.

## New “Jobs For Life” Class

To Start at TBC on September 12

Jobs for Life is an outreach mission designed for persons or who are currently unemployed, OR who are employed, but desire to have a better job. Students make an 8 week, 32 hour investment to make their employment future more promising.

TBC will be hosting a new JfL class on Sunday and Wednesday evenings, beginning Sunday, September 12. This eight week course consists of 16 two hour sessions, combining instruction in principles which build character and in job readiness / job search skills. In addition, each student will be matched with a team of “champions” - their own coaching team to help them succeed through the course as well as new employment. And Graduates will have first priority access to employment interviews in local companies who have made a commitment to JfL and its training. ## Where Did the Furniture Go?

Many parents ask why the Babies and ones rooms look like they do. Many parents have asked; why does my child's room have no furniture. Babies and ones are very active. They crawl, walk, scoot and dart quickly about the room. They enjoy and they need freedom and space to explore in a safe, clean room. For these reasons, fewer pieces of equipment are needed in the room.

In the "Baby B" room a vinyl mat is located in the middle of the room by a mirror. This provides excellent place for floor time. It also gives space for them to crawl and explore. There is a crib for each baby with the headboard against the wall, allowing for adequate ventilation. There are two adult size rockers on each side of the room. These are for the teachers to rock and feed the children. Teachers sit on the floor and interact with the child as they discover their world.

For "Baby C" there is 1 adult-sized rocker, and it is used as needed for feeding or

comforting. Teachers are on the floor interacting and talking to the children.

In the "1A & 1B classrooms" there are foam steps for the children to practice climbing. Because a child likes to imitate an adult rocking, a doll, child-sized rocker, and doll crib is provided for times of imitative play.

There is a shelf unit in both 1's classes that holds a few toys so that the child can make choices. The soft vinyl blocks are stacked on the floor. The teacher invites the child to stack, sit or walk on the blocks whenever he desires. There are no adult-sized rockers in these rooms. The children have room to roam and discover their world.

Our commitment is to provide space for each child to refine his skills as he grows and develops into the person God wants him to be. We are grateful for the opportunity to lay spiritual foundations in the life of your child as we observe him at play.
