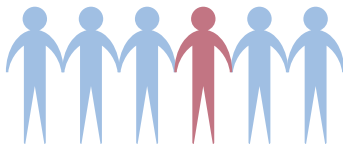

It is good to be home and back with you. Our team in Belize had a marvelous week of ministry. The teams that have previously gone to work with Lagoon Road Baptist Church spent their time literally building the church building. This past week we got to see God build the church. Our team of only 25 planned and executed a Vacation Bible School which grew from 130 the first day to 280 the fourth day. In addition, we provided a dental clinic which treated over 200 patients. In the evenings we would return to the church for revival services and we were blessed to see many come forward on the last night to pray to receive Christ. All of this was accomplished in a church that normally averages 60 to 80 people each Sunday morning in a building space that is the size of our downstairs chapel, with two Sunday School rooms and vestibule that are behind it. To say it was crowded, hot and we were overwhelmed by the response of the village is an understatement, but to express the joy which filled our hearts at the response is also beyond words.

There are several things that I was reminded of in Belize. Here are a few of them:

1. God's Kingdom is larger than I can ever imagine or experience.
2. Our God is the God of the nations.
3. The beauty of a sanctuary is not its appearance when empty but when it is filled with the smiling faces of God's people.
4. It is true that the meek shall inherit the earth.
5. Blessed are the poor for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven.
6. Humility is one of the most important qualities of a Christian.
7. When God's people give and share there is always enough.
8. The gospel of Jesus is a powerful force for change in our lives.
9. When we give from our wealth or our poverty it is beautiful in God's sight.
10. Cooperation with other churches and Christians is still the best way to accomplish the Great Commission.

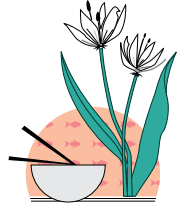
