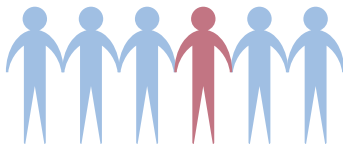

One of the most meaningful worship services for me each year is our Prayer and Healing Service. On Sunday night, August 29 at 6:00 p.m., our Deacons will offer a Prayer and Healing Service to our congregation and community. This service is filled with scripture reading, meditation, silent prayer, corporate prayer and the opportunity for individuals to come to the altar of the church and have members of our deaconate pray with them. I want to encourage all of those in our congregation who are going through a difficult time as the result of grief, loss, disease, job loss or any kind of difficult time to consider coming and being a part of this time of prayer. This is also a time to invite a coworker or family member who is also suffering to come and receive ministry from our congregation. This service is designed not to embarrass anyone and everything that occurs is completely voluntary and confidential. The purpose of the night is to give individuals a time to release burdens and to have others share in their grief and trouble. I hope that you will take this opportunity to let our Deacons minister to you in this special way.

Words from Lydia

The Laborers in Your Vineyard...

I've been here all of a month and a half and I know one thing... you people love the song "Days of Elijah." So I figured I'd run with it.

And we are the laborers in your vineyard declaring the word of the Lord.

As I was reflecting on what to share in this space, the passage in John where Christ shares the "I am" statement comparing himself to the vine and us to the branches of that vine continued to come up in my mind. Beginning in John 15:1, Christ says that he is the true vine and that God the Father is the gardener. Then a bit further into the passage he repeats that he is the vine and we are the branches who must remain in him in order that he will remain in us.

We remain in Christ by striving everyday to be more and more like Christ. And, how do we do that? Love. The Scriptures repeat over and over that God is love, that our greatest command is to love, and that the greatest of virtues is love. As much as it repeats itself, we should probably take notice. Christ says

that apart from him we can do nothing, and apart from him we are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. As branches of the true vine we must cling to him who loves us as the Father has loved him.

So, let's turn over a new leaf and begin truly loving our neighbors and our enemies. Let's commit to stop gossiping and to start including those who seem to be on the outside. Let's commit to a radical kind of love that has the power and the authority to change the world. Start in your families, but build it up – working through your friend group, your school, our community, our nation, and eventually our world. Christ came to set us free from the bondage of sin and hatred, and now we need to start acting like free people declaring the word of the Lord!

...go and bear fruit – fruit that will last. Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name. This is my command: Love each other.

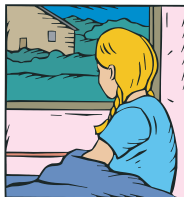
