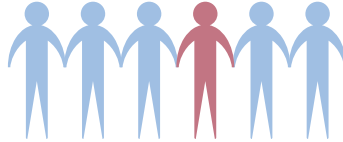

This past Sunday, we honored Rev. Hal Melton for his 10 years of service as our Associate Pastor and Minister with Adults. When I became your pastor in 2000, I discovered that one of the goals for the church was to become “more hands on”, in regards to missions. When we called Rev. Melton, only a few months after my arrival, he became the point person to enable this to occur. Over the past 10 years, Trinity has become one of the churches known not only for our community, but to those in North Carolina Baptist life as a “missional church.” In his recent book, “The Samaritan Way”, Dr. David Crocker describes the mission culture of Trinity Baptist Church. This change in our mission culture can be primarily attributed to Rev. Melton. Since his arrival, we have developed mission partnerships with CBF, SBC, North Carolina Baptist Men, Jobs for Life, Wake Interfaith Hospitality Network and Operation Christmas Child, just to name a few. Our mission’s budget has grown as we have helped to send groups from Trinity on missions, as well as send individual Trinity members on special mission opportunities. In addition, Hal has helped our church develop a new ministry to married adults, along with his wife Roberta. Their emphasis on developing the marriage relationship is something that is beneficial to the whole church. Hal has also continued to help us develop our Sunday School and Discipleship Training Ministries. Yet, beyond all of these programs, Hal’s greatest contribution has been his genuine care for those hurting in our congregation. Hal continues to be a superb counselor and friend to so many who are going through long term difficulties in our church. This ministry, which is not seen by many, is greatly appreciated by me. We have been truly blessed to have Rev. Hal Melton as a part of our staff these past 10 years and are praying that God will continue to bless his ministry in our years ahead here at Trinity. Please take time to tell Hal how much you appreciate his ministry, the next time you see him.

I look forward to our time together, this week, as we continue our series on “Life Questions.” This week, we will think about what real security is all about. I look forward to seeing you in worship, this week.

Words from Andy

Being a Christian leader is not an easy task. First, Christian leaders refer to more than called ministers on staff of the church. It also refers to our Sunday School teachers, small group leaders and ministry leaders who have answered the call to strengthen the body of Christ. As leaders, we are given the important task of leading others for the Kingdom of God. We have accepted a higher level of living in order to be examples for those we lead.

Oswald Chambers, in his book *Workmen of God*, wrote: "I want to give one word of warning to workers for God, especially Sunday-school teachers and preachers of the Gospel – beware of the snare of putting anything first in your mind but Jesus Christ. If you put the needs of your people first, there is something between you and the power of God. Face Jesus Christ steadily, and allow

nothing, no work and no person, to come between you and Him."

Eugene Peterson wrote in his book *Working the Angles*, that there are three components to continual intimacy with God: prayer, Scripture reading, and spiritual direction. As leaders, it takes intentional time of prayer, Scripture reading and mentoring someone to stay connected with our source of power.

Sadly, I know I struggle with these three components. It seems the next meeting, the next event or the next crisis gets in the way of spending time with God. I also know that many of our Sunday School teachers and small group leaders struggle to create time with the Maker of Heaven and Earth. This week, pray for all of our church leaders to feel the presence of God near them and that they will be able to spend quality time with God.

Thoughts For Parents...

Separation Anxiety

There are several reasons why a young child may cry when their parents leave.

- The child may cry because he/she now realizes you still exist although you are out of sight.
- As babies and ones develop, they may experience stranger and separation anxieties. During this time, a child's emotions are intense but short-lived.

Both of these are a healthy part of emotional development.

Tips for keeping the departure less stressful:

- Talk positively about your child's teachers, activities, and friends.
- Keep the morning calm and unrushed.
- Develop a goodbye routine (even with newborns). Try a gentle hug and a simple "Mommy will come back."
- Excitedly encourage your toddler to walk to his room, carry his bag and knock on the door.
- Never sneak away. Be calm and leave promptly. If your child clings, calmly remove him. Kindly say "Daddy will come back." Leave in a confident manner.
