We partner directly with Hills and Hollers Ministries' director Jim Cmolik to provide materials and labor for one or two homes desperately in need of repair. Through Jim, we also get to meet pastors and other non-profit coordinators who have needs that we can meet through various means such as VBS with children, working with abused women and their children, visiting with the "elderly" of the county, food pantries and clothing closets, etc. We want this partnership to attract both those who enjoy construction, and those who would rather do other things.

We stay at the "Mission House" in Whitley City operated by Jim that accommodates 30 adults in bunk beds with mattresses, with air conditioning, dining area, meeting area and a front porch swing. Our Trinity Cook Team, headed by Dorothy Petty feeds us home cooked meals. Just down the road is the "Dairy Bar" where the TBC team goes to literally "chill out" each evening.

If this sounds like a mission in which you would enjoy participating, please sign up NOW on the Registration Board in the Narthex. It will fill up fast, so don't wait! The non-construction portion of our trip will be announced around the first of March.

## Sharing & Taking Turns

Good behavior depends on a sense of responsibility, which evolves as your preschooler recognizes that there's more to life than immediate gratification of his needs. Assuming responsibility for his/her actions is a basic social requirement. He/she needs to understand that aggressive behavior such as hitting; kicking and pushing aren't acceptable ways of dealing with frustration.



To get along with others he/she must cooperate by sharing and taking turns.

Your unconditional love makes your preschooler feel worthy, which contributes to his/her self-esteem, a vital prerequisite for good behavior, as well as getting along with others. If he/she feels good about themselves, they will be motivated to behave well. Without a positive self image and reputation to live up to, he has little incentive.
