This past weekend I was able to attend the General Assembly of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of North Carolina. The two days were filled with seeing old friends, meeting new people in the Baptist family, inspirational worship and workshops and being reminded of all the ways that our work together as Baptists makes a difference in people's lives. When you and I give to our church budget, we help support the work of the CBFNC. Through CBFNC we support many of our traditional North Carolina Baptist Ministries. These include: North Carolina Baptist Colleges, the Divinity Schools at Campbell University, Gardner-Webb University, Wake Forest University and the Baptist House at Duke. Our mission funds also support the work of the Baptist Children's Home, the Baptist Retirement Homes and the Pastoral Care at Baptist Hospital. In addition, through CBFNC we support the mission work and education of the North Carolina Baptist Men and the Women's Missionary Union. Joining in ministry with this mission partner we help start new churches, train young Baptist leaders and work with other Baptists around the world through the Baptist World Alliance. CBFNC is also our primary partner in coordinating our ongoing mission work in Belize.

Words from Andy

I have started my research for my first year paper for my doctoral dissertation. Since what I am reading is always on my mind, you will get to read some of my research in this column. My research focus is how academic pressures of high school students affect their faith journey.

One of the books I have read is *The Price of Privilege* by Madeline Levine. She is a practicing psychologist of 30+ years to mainly upper middle class clients. Through her experience and research, she surmises that adolescents of financially stable families are now more at-risk than any other population. "America's newly defined at-risk group is preteens and teens from affluent, well-educated families. In spite of their economic and social advantages, they experience among the highest rates of depression, substance abuse, anxiety disorders, somatic complaints, and unhappiness of any group of children in this country." Research is now showing that material wealth often lead to significant disadvantages for adolescents. Money, power, education, prestige and material goods offer no protection against unhappiness and emotional illness.

Studies have shown that 22% of girls from financially comfortable homes suffer from clinical depression. This is 3 times the national average for girls. There is also a higher rate in the guys but not as significant as the girls. However, the guys in 11th & 12th grades are using drugs and alcohol at a higher rate to self-medicate themselves from depression.

Affluent teens are increasingly immersed in peer culture that values substance abuse and delinquency. This turns into deviancy training for the teens and increases the chance of delinquency, substance abuse, violence and psychopathology as an adult.

Levine's research and findings are disturbing. I often wonder how our students make it out of adolescence and become productive adults in society. Then I am reminded how much greater God's faithfulness and sovereignty are than the problems of this world. We must rest in God's love and grace while depending on his power to sustain us through life's struggles. We need to remind our students of the greatness of our God every opportunity we get!

Thoughts For Parents...

Sharing and Taking Turns

Good behavior depends on a sense of responsibility, which evolves as your preschooler recognizes that there's more to life than immediate gratification of his needs. Assuming responsibility for his/her actions is a basic social requirement. He/she needs to understand that aggressive behavior such as hitting, kicking and pushing aren't acceptable ways of dealing with frustration. To get along with others he/she must cooperate by sharing and taking turns.

Your unconditional love makes your preschooler feel worthy, which contributes to



his/her self-esteem, a vital prerequisite for good behavior, as well as getting along with others. If he/she feels good about themselves, they will be motivated to behave well. Without a positive self image and reputation to live up to, he has little incentive.
