Where were you when the world stop turning? Those were the words of Alan Jackson's song, which commemorated September 11, 2001. This coming Sunday is the 10th Anniversary of the attack on the World Trade Center and Pentagon. People all over our nation will gather to remember this dreadful day and offer prayers for families who still grieve and others whose lives have been forever changed by that day. I, like so many of you, can remember the beautiful blue sky day when we witnessed what seemed at first to be a terrible accident, that soon was revealed to be a terrible deliberate attack on innocent people. My memory is filled not only with the images from the day but of images of co-workers in the office not sure what to do next. I am reminded that Robin was at the Watergate Hotel in Washington D.C. very close to the Pentagon and I was praying and hoping she was safe and could find a way to get back home with her flight cancelled. I was praying and checking on church members who were traveling around the world and trying to get home, as well.

If you were like me that day, then its memory produced many feelings. There was shock, fear, anxiety, grief, revenge and of course compassion and concern. I can distinctly remember the days that followed seeing strangers wander in from the streets to sit quietly in our sanctuary, reflect, and pray. It does seem that days like this one cause us to spend time thinking about God, what is important, and what the purpose of our lives really needs to be.

As I think about other days, I recall that those too are days when I became aware of God's mercy, grace, goodness, and presence. What about you? What days do you remember the most? Do you remember God's presence or are you distinctly aware that God seemed absent in those moments?

As I think about 9/11, I am aware that there are some moments we remember more than others and in that moment, we recall God's work. As we come to worship this coming Sunday, I want us to consider "Moments We Remember" from Exodus 14:19-31. Let's join together and call to our common memory God's goodness, love, and care.

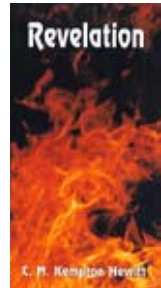

## How Does my Preschooler Learn About God? (Part 2)

You may be thinking to yourself, "How do I teach Bible truths to my preschooler at home?" As a parent, you should know how your child prefers to learn. There are many ways you may help him learn along the way. As the preschool teachers plan activities to guide his learning, you can do the same thing at home during the week. Each Sunday your child should come home with 'learner guides' that will offer simple easy to follow

directions and tips to guide the learning of your children. Take time each night to review the Bible story printed on the front of each page. Read the parent tips and strengthen the time you spend together. Each take home sheet also includes an activity to help guide him as he learns. Plan to do this activity with your child sometime during the week. Save the learner guide pages each week. When the activities are done, punch the sides with a three hole punch and put them in a notebook to keep. Review them frequently to reinforce Bible truths learned each week.

## Safety & Security In the Preschool Ministry Area

- Doors to preschool classrooms should be kept shut and only the preschoolers, the children and their leaders are allowed into the rooms. Parents or legal guardians should remain in the hall when dropping off and picking up their children.
- Two non-related adults should be present with preschoolers or children at all times.
- A designated leader such as the Preschool Sunday School Division Director or the Mission Friends Director patrols the halls during program activities.
- Parents or legal guardians are expected to use a sign-in and sign-out sheet for preschoolers. Parents of preschoolers may be given a pager, security tag or security card from their child's teacher when signing in.
- Preschool children should be released to a parent or guardian with the proper identification. This includes a security card or pager.

**Preschoolers are not to be released to anyone without proper identification.**
