In Genesis 2:3, we are told, “God blessed the seventh day and made it holy.” The day itself was not different, only its intended use. The Bible instructs us to have a Sabbath day to rest, worship, and enjoy the company of God and others. The Sabbath day was intended to be a day that was different from the other days. It was to be a day where we rested from our labor and experienced a different rhythm to life. In our culture, Sunday has become a day that does have a different rhythm to most. Although there are certain essential jobs that must be performed every day of the week and restaurants and stores that remain open on Sundays for business, most Americans do enjoy the day off from work on Sunday. The rhythm of Sunday is different for most families from the rhythm of the other days. The day begins with a little more sleep. The day can be filled with the pursuit of one’s favorite activity, sport, yard work, or trip with the family. There is nothing wrong with any of these activities and to a certain degree, we are getting the Sunday blessing right. God did create and bless this day for us out of love. God wants there to be a day we simply enjoy the blessings of health, family, friends, creation, and laughter. Yet, when we participate in all of these blessings of God and forget the God who created them, then we have spent a hollow Sabbath Day. Worship is still essential to having a truly “blessed and holy” seventh day. When we gather to worship each week on this holy day we are reminded of what is truly important in life. We are called to view our lives from a different perspective. We discover that God loves us and that it is God and not ourselves that have created the blessings we enjoy. In worship, we are reminded of the importance of community and the strength that comes from being with God’s people. We need to know that we are not in this journey alone. Worship leads us to God and to others, both of which are a blessing.

I want to encourage you as an individual and as a family to use the Sabbath day as the gift it was intended to be. Let it be a day where the rhythm of your life changes. Enjoy your family, friends, and God’s gifts. Yet, don’t forget worship as a part of the day. Worship will give meaning to all the other blessings of Sunday.

Trinity Family, by the time you see this, we will have accomplished our **22nd Operation Inasmuch** together. When we were first getting started in 2001, we would have over 325 volunteers sign up for OIAM projects. This fall we have just under 200 including several Sunday School class projects that were not listed in the OIAM brochure. At first glance, it looks as though we have taken a step backwards!

However, in 2001, North Raleigh Ministries didn't exist, and TBC was not involved in Wake Interfaith Hospitality Network, Jobs for Life, Disaster Relief, hosting community Blood Drives and Flu Shot Clinics, and the Rural Poverty Initiative in McCreary Co, KY. These missions now have hundreds participating on a regular ongoing basis throughout the year – in addition to those who still participate in OIAM in the spring and fall.

OIAM in many ways has served to foster the evolution of these other ongoing missions at TBC. It continues to be the easiest way for TBC members of all ages and abilities to get their “feet wet” and “have their eyes opened” to the missions we can do right here in our back yard. Thanks to all of you who volunteered to serve as the hands and feet of Christ last week through OIAM. I especially want to say a big **Thank You to Lou Ann O'Bryant**, who is our TBC OIAM coordinator – Job well done!

Now, let's talk about the **North Raleigh Ministries Food Pantry**. Each, member church is free to come up with their own ideas about collecting food on a regular basis. TBC decided years ago to encourage the food donated each week to be part of the Sunday worship “offering” – and the ushers place a basket of food on the altar after the offering is taken – in addition to the offering

plates. This way, as we dedicate our tithes and offering to God's use, we also dedicate the food donated to the NRM Food Pantry.

In the past several weeks, the food pantry has gotten critically low of many items and are completely OUT of several key items they need all the time. Would you please see the list elsewhere in this newsletter and bring several bags of groceries to worship with you next Sunday? Let's re-stock the food pantry and Help Our Neighbors in Need. Thanks!

Thoughts For Parents...

Weathering the Storms

Why do some preschoolers seem happy one Sunday, then tearful and clingy the next? There may be many reasons for their change of behavior. At promotion time, leaving familiar surroundings and teachers can be difficult. Then, preschoolers must adjust to a new classroom and new teachers. It is not unusual for some children to experience difficulty with separation or change.

Tearful separations are not only difficult for preschoolers—they are also stressful for the parents. The good news is that these moments rarely last forever. With love and patience, parents can help their children through these trying times. The following ideas may help as you weather storms of tears.

- Talk with your preschooler throughout the week about Sunday school. Always speak in a positive, reassuring manner.
- Welcome your child's teacher into your home and help your preschooler get to know them.
- Pray with your child, asking God to calm his fears and anxieties.
- Talk with your preschooler's Sunday school teacher. Some parents are willing to let their child cry for a brief time even though it is not easy. Very often after a short cry, many preschoolers will become busy with an activity and play happily for the remainder

of the class time. Other parents are reluctant to leave a crying, unhappy child. Help your preschooler's Sunday School teacher devise a plan of action that you are comfortable with.

- After making a plan, follow through. If you decide to leave your preschooler in Sunday School despite the tears, do not prolong your exit. Give a good-bye kiss, state your intent to return soon, and leave.
- Make certain your preschooler gets plenty of rest the night before and if possible, eats breakfast before coming to church.

Even though periods of separation anxiety can be difficult for parents as well as preschoolers, patience, prayer and consistency are key as you help your preschooler through this growing process. You might post a card with Philippians 4:6-7 above your kitchen sink to remind you that God promises peace of mind and heart to those who make requests of Him in prayer with thanksgiving.
